We are delighted that TRH The Earl and Countess of Wessex will briefly attend the Festival to join the community at this time of celebration.

**THE SWINGING BLUE JEANS** were formed in Liverpool in 1961 where they played at The Cavern Club with The Beatles. Their top ten hits included *Hippy Hippy Shake*, *Good Golly Miss Molly* and *You're No Good*

The fabulous SBJ are joined by special guest Sunningdale's own **CHIP HAWKES**, former bassist, singer and songwriter with the Tremeloes. Chip helped his son, former Charters pupil Chesney, to a number one hit in 1991. Nowadays he performs solo or with his own band, and guests with many re-formed bands of the 60s and 70s.

**THE REPLAYS** are a seven-strong band from Hampshire. Formed in 2003 they play a variety of rock, soul, blues and pop across the decades of the Queen's reign.

**RICKY RECKLESS** Sometimes known as Ivan Chandler, music copyright expert and former keyboard player for Dusty Springfield, Lulu and Cat Stevens.

**The Brits Musical Theatre** is celebrated with songs from your favourite shows including Oliver, Phantom of the Opera, Cats and Blood Brothers and featuring guest soloists and chorus.

The next project we are helping to promote in the village is **Care Bank**, a volunteering scheme that offers practical help to older members of our community. Launched in March 2012 by the Borough and managed by WRVS, volunteers earn 1 Reward Voucher for every hour of voluntary work under **Care Bank**. Reward Vouchers can be exchanged for certain services around the Borough, For example, 50% discount for a swim or gym session at any of the Borough's Leisure centres, or 50% off Library DVD or other media rentals. There is still much work to be done in evaluating where the future houses should be

located, how to develop the retail centres and jobs, and how to protect our green, leafy environment. We also have an opportunity to take advantage of the New Homes Bonus from the new homes being built to put forward projects the community would like to see achieved. All this works in tandem with the Borough Local Plan which is also currently being written. We will be consulting again as ideas firm up and then ultimately The Plan will be subject to a Referendum. ### **Hosepipe ban**

Despite recent rains we are still short of water following the fifth driest March recorded since 1910. A hose pipe ban is in force in our area and we have to cut back on the 350 litres of water per day used on average by UK households.
