

Parking in RBWM car park. As of 1 July 2014 London Road Car Park will be restricted to short stay (Max 3 hours) or business permit holders only between the hours of 8am and 6pm Monday to Saturday.

Short stay users (40 spaces) will be required to enter their vehicle registration into a pay and display machine to obtain a free of charge pay and display ticket which will need to be displayed in their vehicle.

Businesses in Sunningdale will be able to apply for Business Permits for use in the permit bays (77 spaces) which must be displayed in their vehicle.

Additional changes will be made to On Street parking on the eastern and western end of the London Road, the London Road slip road (adjacent to the station), Ridge Mount Road and Charters Road.

All of the above changes are designed to increase the availability of short term parking in Sunningdale as well as maintaining enough long term parking for businesses and their employees. The scheme will be reviewed after six months of operation to ascertain if the desired effect is being achieved.



Sustainable Sunningdale

It's now certain that the climate is changing rapidly and we need to reduce our use of carbon fuels rapidly if we are to keep the temperature rise to below 2 degrees of average rise this century. For the sake of our children and our grandchildren we must take big and small measures to cut back our emissions.

1. Support renewable energy. The Parish Council uses only 100% renewable energy by getting our electricity from Ecotricity and we are not paying more than the big 6 energy companies. Find out more from www.ecotricity.co.uk
2. Switch your bulbs from the old incandescent to energy savers – using only 5% of the energy for lighting. A small act of commitment that makes a difference.
3. Save the bees – plant flowers and bushes as food for bees. www.foe.co.uk

Neighbourhood Plan – Approved at Referendum

The Referendum on 27 March approved the plan by a vote of 91% in favour – a 23.64% turn-out. This is just the 10th NP in the UK to have completed all its processes. The Plan will now proceed to the meeting of the Borough Council on 29 April 2014, with a recommendation to formally adopt the plan. It is then a statutory document which has to be taken into consideration for any future planning applications. It was achieved through 3 years of hard-work by a team of community volunteers, much community consultation and tremendous leadership from Margaret Morgan, Diana Tombs and others.

The plan will not stop future developments as it had to support a propensity in favour of development but we trust that developments will be constrained by the policies in the plan. For any larger development there is a requirement for a Development Brief which includes community consultation – this is a significant innovation brought in with the plan. The plan policies will protect our trees and green spaces, and have introduced wildlife corridors across the area to support our wildlife and biodiversity.

Parish Councillors

It was wonderful to get a positive response to our request for people to come forward to be Councillors. **Anne-Catherine Buxton**, who has lived in Sunningdale for 16 years, was elected unopposed. Anne-Catherine writes “*I feel that I can contribute towards the future of our community in various ways, including dealing with development, parking, green spaces and local businesses. I am a*



mother of three children and have worked previously with both local and national charities over many years, as well as with one of our local sports clubs.”
