Foil Recycling Just Got Easier

Clean aluminium foil can now be recycled at home along with your other recyclables in your weekly blue recycling bin. This includes clean sheet cooking foil, aluminium foil tops and clean aluminium food containers. To check if your foil can be recycled, try to scrunch it - if it springs back, it isn't aluminium foil and cannot be accepted. 100% of the clean aluminium foil you recycle remains in the UK and Europe and is turned into new metal products.
